Revelation 17:1-19:10 (focal, 19:6)

This week we come to Revelation 17:1-19:10 where we will see Babylon exposed, fallen and replaced. Babylon, the harlot, is judged; the bride steps forward. The glossy, glitzy world of Babylon is overthrown; God’s people emerge, with shining, pure linen to wear as God’s own gift. The marriage of the Lamb and his bride is to be the focal point of the marriage of heaven and earth themselves, and Babylon, the symbolic equivalent of the ancient Babel which thought to climb up to heaven by its own energy, is shown up as a futile parody of the real thing, a human attempt to get, by sheer greed, what God proposed to give by sheer grace.
